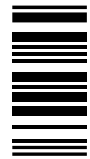

REFERENDUM AMENDING ETHICS AND INSPECTOR GENERAL PROVISIONS OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE

Ballot Summary: Shall Ordinance 2014-747-E, which amends the Jacksonville Charter by (1) extending the jurisdiction of the city's ethics code and inspector general's office to also cover the city's independent agencies and constitutional officers; providing for (2) investigation and oversight of city transactions, (3) administrative sharing, and agreements, (4) independent legal counsel, (5) investigation accreditation (6) independent selection and removal (7) January 1, 2016 effective date and (8) severability, become effective?

Financial Impact Estimate: Increasing the scope of the Inspector General will require the additional cost of hiring subject matter professionals, although with no guarantee, it has the potential through its findings to produce tax payer savings to offset those costs and save additional dollars.

Financial Impact Estimate: This straw ballot, if implemented, will have a minimal impact on revenues and costs for the City of Jacksonville.
